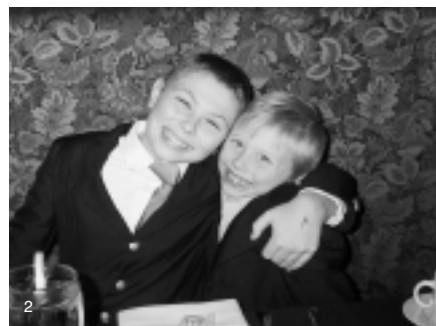

UPHA to host new Academy Equitation Challenge

In a joint effort to help educate riders and promote equitation at the academy level, UPHA Chapter 10 and Chapter 3/4 have joined forces to create the UPHA Academy Equitation Challenge. Three shows throughout the year will be hosting qualifying classes for advanced and intermediate academy riders. The class will consist of rail work followed by a standard workout. Riders who finish first or second in the qualifying classes are eligible to show in the \$750 Championship class that will be held at the November UPHA Chapter 10 Academy Horse Show in Elgin, Ill., on November 13th and 14th. Two US Savings bonds will be awarded to the first and second place riders with \$500 going to first and \$250 going to second place.

The three shows that will be hosting this year's qualifying classes will be the UPHA Chapter 10 Academy Horse Show on April 10th and 11th at Indian Hill Equestrian Center, ASAW Summer Academy Horse Show held July 17th and 18th at the Wild Wind Equine Center in Waukesha, Wisc., and then the final qualifier followed by the Championship class will be held at the UPHA Chapter 10 Academy Horse Show held on November 13th and 14th again at the Indian Hills Equestrian Center.

Indianapolis Charity Horse Show Dates, Judges, Venue

The 36th annual Indianapolis Charity Horse Show verifies the dates for the show. The show will start Wednesday, June 2, with an evening session. It will end Saturday evening, June 5. This positions the show so it does not conflict with other shows in the Midwest.

Divisions offered are: Saddlebred, Hackney, Morgan, Roadster, Friesian, Equitation and Academy. Some of the more specialized classes offered are: UPHA Classics for Saddlebreds and Hackneys, Challenge Cups, the Pink Ribbon class, NHS "Good Hands", Saddle & Bridle's trio of classes, AHHS Medallions to name a few. An important feature is that the Indianapolis Charity Horse Show is a qualifying show for the Kentucky World Championship Show.

Lewis Eckard of Hildebran, N.C., will judge all divisions except Academy. The Academy judge will be announced at a later date.

The show is changing venues within the Indiana State Fairgrounds. A large performance ring will be built especially for the show in the Toyota Blue Ribbon Pavilion. The building has recently been renovated, is light, air conditioned and adjacent to the covered outdoor ring. Ring side tables will be available. The Show Office, vendors and concessions will all be contained within the one building. Stabling will be in the South and West Pavilions as before. Each Pavilion will have its own work ring. When not being used as the make-up ring the covered outdoor ring will provide a third work area. Special attention will be paid to the footing in all areas.
