Hey Everyone! I can't believe it is October already, so for this month we have cool costumes for your horses for Halloween. I'm not saying you have to take your horse out trick-or-treating with you because your horse wouldn't get much in his/her bag.

First costume is a Mexican costume. You would need to get a sombrero and cut out ear holes. Get some of those really huge sunglasses, and a cool scarf to wrap in back of your horse's ears.

Second is a Tinkerbell costume. You need a big piece of cloth that fastens at the bottom than attach wings to the top and you have Tinkerbell.
